

TERMS OF THE COMPETITION AND LOCAL RULES FOR THE JUNIOR 6s

The Rules of Golf as approved by the USGA and The R&A govern play. Unless otherwise provided, penalty for breach of a Local Rule or Condition is two strokes in stroke play or loss of hole in match play.

LOCAL RULES

LIST OF CONFORMING GOLF BALLS: Any ball used in making a stroke must be on the current List of Conforming Golf Balls issued by the USGA. Penalty for breach of this condition is disqualification.

LIST OF CONFORMING DRIVER HEADS: Any driver the player uses to make a stroke must have a clubhead, identified by model and loft, which is on the current List of Conforming Driver Heads issued by the USGA. Penalty for making a stroke with a driver in breach of this rule is disqualification.

GROOVE AND PUNCH MARK SPECIFICATIONS: In making a stroke, the player must use clubs that conform to the groove and punch mark specifications in the Equipment Rules that took effect on 1 January 2010. Penalty for making a stroke with a club in breach of this rule is disqualification. There is no penalty for carrying but not making a stroke with a club which does not conform to these groove and punch mark specifications.

STOPPING AND RESUMING PLAY: Suspension for a dangerous situation: One long prolonged siren or airhorn note. All other types of suspensions (i.e., for darkness): Three consecutive airhorn notes. Resumption of play: Two airhorn notes. When play has been suspended for a dangerous situation, all practice facilities are deemed to be closed until declared open by the Tournament Team.

PRACTICE: Prior to and after a round in stroke play, a player may practice on the designated practice areas. A player may not practice on the competition course before or between rounds. Penalty for first breach of this rule is two strokes. Penalty for second breach of this rule is disqualification.

PRACTICE BETWEEN HOLES: Between the play of two holes, a player must not make any practice strokes on or near the putting green of the hole just completed or test the surface of that putting green by rubbing the putting green or rolling a ball. Penalty for breach of this rule is two strokes.

CADDIES: JUNIOR 6s players (U/19) are permitted to have a bag puller throughout all adidas Junior 6s Tour events. A bag puller must use a pull cart or carry the player's clubs. Riding in a cart as a bag puller is not permitted.

Players in the '19-25' category are permitted to have caddies.

Motorised push carts are permitted.

Advice is considered any verbal comment or action that is intended to influence you or another player in choosing a club, making a stroke, or deciding how to play during a hole or round. In addition, any conversation between player/spectator may be construed as advice. This includes any conversation between player/spectator in their native language. In either instance, penalty for breach of this rule is two strokes. Players are responsible for the actions of their relatives and spectators in regards to this rule.

Keeping the above statement in mind, please keep your conversation with the player to words of encouragement as long as advice is not given.

SPECTATORS attend adidas Junior 6s events at their own risk. Spectators should stay one shot ahead of the group they are following. This allows spectators to follow errant shots and help identify where the ball comes to rest. Spectators are allowed to help in the search for lost golf balls.

PROHIBITING USE OF MOTORIZED TRANSPORTATION: Except when permitted by JUNIOR 6s staff or during the playing of the Super 6s Knockout. Exception: a player may ride in designated shuttles and may accept transportation from a Rules Official.

MOBILE PHONES: Please silence your mobile phone while at adidas Junior 6s events or abide by the Host Facilities policy, whichever is stricter. Phones may be used for scoring purposes if you have a direct relationship with the group you are following and no player has access to a phone or data to keep live scores up to date. At no point are you to question

scores. If you feel scores may be incorrect please advise the Tournament Team prior to the completion of the round.

CARTS: The JUNIOR 6s allows spectator carts dependant on availability at each venue. Carts are to be booked directly through the host venue and must not be driven on the fairway at any stage. Players and spectators are not permitted to ride on the back of a golf cart at any time during JUNIOR 6s competitions. Spectators should stay on cart paths. In the absence of cart paths, we ask that spectators stay in the rough. Please stay off fairways, tees and greens.

RULINGS: Please seek a JUNIOR 6s rules official if the need arises. Spectators must NOT give rulings.

TEMPORARY IMMOVABLE OBSTRUCTIONS: If a player has interference from a Temporary Immovable Obstruction the player may take relief on either side of the Temporary Immovable Obstruction.

REPLACEMENT OF CLUB THAT IS BROKEN OR SIGNIFICANTLY DAMAGED: A player may replace a club that is damaged during the normal course of play. Any club that is damaged in frustration MAY NOT be replaced.

INTEGRAL OBJECTS: Include cables, rods, wires and wrappings when closely attached to trees, and artificial walls and pilings when located in penalty areas and bunkers.

WOOD CHIPS AND MULCH: Are loose impediments.

TERMS OF THE JUNIOR 6s

SCORING: Players must score through Golf Genius during play. All players must have the Golf Genius app downloaded prior to play and score for another person. Digital Scorecards are to be verified by players and markers at the completion of each round. Scoring discrepancies are to be reported to the score return desk immediately following players returning from the golf course

RESULTS OF THE JUNIOR 6s: The competition is final when the trophy has been presented to the winner or, in the absence of an awards ceremony, when all scores have been approved by the Tournament Team. The result of a match is final when the Tournament Team has approved the result as posted on the public scoreboard or via online scoring.

FIELD: Maximum 100 players per event.

ENTRY FEES: \$220 per event (\$160 The Australian Junior 6s).

WAGR: All events official World Amateur Golf Ranking events, with the exception of the event held at The Australian Golf Club).

SUPER 6s: Top male and top female from the Strokeplay qualify for Super 6s Knockout and are entitled to the bonus points from the match.

WORLD FINAL QUALIFICATION CRITERIA: Players must play a minimum of 6 events to qualify for the World Final. Winners of any 54 hole events are exempt into the final.

JUNIOR 6s ELIGIBILITY: Entries in handicap order (tournament winners exempt).

FUTURE 6's (19-25 CATEGORY) ELIGIBILITY: To be determined by 2022 Golf Australia Order of Merit ranking with 4 invitations per event.

DEADLINES: Entries close 2 weeks prior to tournament starting date.

LATE ENTRIES: All late entries will incur a \$50 late entry fee and must be approved by the Tournament Team regardless of the size of the field.

WITHDRAWAL: Withdrawal after entry deadline will only be refunded with a medical certificate.
